Dick Allen joins the White Sox and completes a fabulous season: A team leading 37 home runs, 113 runs batted in, 156 base hits, and 90 runs scored which earns "The Wampum Walloper" the American League's Most Valuable Player Award. (Allen is a native of Wampum, PA.) Carlos May was second on the team with 12 homers, 68 RBI, and 83 runs scored. He led the ball club with 161 base hits for the year. The White Sox hit .238 and 108 home runs. Their 100 stolen bases were second in the league...Knuckleballer Wilbur Wood led the pitching staff with 24 victories, 20 complete games, and eight shutouts. He struck out 193 batters. Stan Bahnsen was 21-16. Tom Bradley (15-14 W/L record) was the staff leader with 209 K's. Closer Terry Forster rang up 104 strikeouts. The staff's ERA was 3.12 with 42 saves--the latter second in the A.L...Allen capped his season by stroking TWO inside-the-park home runs in the same game, July 31st, an 8-1 win against the Twins in Minnesota...The Sox finished the campaign just 5 ½ games behind the A's who won the season series, 8-7. The Texas Rangers were easy pickins' with Chicago winning that series, 14-4...During this time, White Sox Park (aka Comiskey Park) featured an artificial surface infield--with the usual dirt base paths--and an all natural grass outfield. The grand old ball park on Chicago's Southside welcomed just over 1.17 million fans through its turnstiles to enjoy baseball and beloved organist Nancy Faust.
