**December 10, 1971: The Angels trade Jim Fregosi to the Mets for Nolan Ryan and others long forgotten: Frank Estrada, Don Rose, and Leroy Stanton. Ryan struck out future Indians and Phillies manager, Charlie Manuel (Twins utilityman), April 18<sup>th</sup>, for the 500<sup>th</sup> strikeout of Ryan's career...Bob Oliver led the Halos with 19 home runs and 70 RBI. Leroy Stanton was next with 12 homers (39 RBI) while Vada Pinson was second with 49 runs batted in (seven dingers). Sandy Alomar, Sr. had team highs in base hits (146) and runs scored (65). Angels' batters hit .242 with 78 home runs...Ryan led the pitching staff with 19 wins, 329 strikeouts, 157 walks, and 20 complete games. Clyde Wright was an 18-game winner and completed 15 games. Rudy May won twelve. As a staff, the Angels had a 3.06 ERA, 1,000 strikeouts to lead the league, and 57 complete games placing them seventh...California finished 18 games in back of division champion, Oakland, who won the season series, 10-8. They were 10-7 against Texas who ended the season in last place 20 ½ games behind the Angels...The "halo" has disappeared from the top of the Angels' caps and can now be found on the front incorporated into a new logo with an upper-case A. The team also transitioned to the stylish double-knit beltless uniforms coming into vogue in MLB.**
