*The Brewers moved to the AL East in '72 with a bad ball club which finished dead last in attendance. Dave Bristol was fired as manager, May 27<sup>th</sup>, with a 10-20 record and not too much to work with for a team...The old Milwaukee Brave, Del Crandall, moved into the skipper's office permanently from Triple A Evansville, three days later, and guided the team to a 54-70 mark the rest of the way... John Briggs (65 RBI) led the Brewers with 21 home runs. George Scott was the team leader with 88 RBI, 154 base hits, 71 runs scored, and 24 doubles. He was right behind Briggs with 20 homers. Milwaukee hit .235 as a team and 88 home runs for the season...Jim Lonborg was the pitching staff's top winner with 14 victories. His 143 K's and eleven complete games led the hurlers as well. Bill Parsons was an even 13-13 with ten complete games and 111 strikeouts. The staff's ERA was 3.45...Milwaukee finished 21 games in back of the first-place Tigers who won the season series, 10-8. The Brewers manhandled the Indians, 10-5, to win their season series. They split with the Yankees, 9-9...Milwaukee scored 493 runs and allowed 595 for the year.*
