The Bosox finished just one-half game behind Detroit in the AL East during a strike-shortened season. (Boston played 155 games; Detroit played 156.) The Red Sox won five of fourteen games during the regular season against the Tigers. The commissioner's office decided with the resumption of play that the cancelled games would NOT be made up...Carlton Fisk was voted the American League Rookie of the Year...Team leaders: Fisk (22 homers); Rico Petrocelli (75 RBI); Marty Pattin (17 wins, 13 complete games, 168 strikeouts). Part-time starter Luis Tiant ended the season with 15 victories, 12 complete games, 123 strikeouts, and a team high six shutouts. "Sonny" Siebert was a twelve-game winner...Reggie Smith hit 21 homers to go with 74 RBI while Carl Yastrzemski popped 12 home runs and drove home sixty-eight. Tommy Harper was the team leader in base hits (141), runs scored (92), and doubles (29)...The Red Sox hit .248 as a team and led the league with 640 runs, 229 doubles, and 34 triples. They hit 124 homers...The staff ERA was 3.47 including 48 complete games and 18 shutouts...Fenway Park hosted just over 1.44 million fans.
