In a season abbreviated by a spring training players' strike, the Cubbies finished 11 games behind NL East Champ, Pittsburgh...Leo "The Lip" Durocher was fired at the All Star break with a 46-44 record. "Whitey" Lockman took command, July 27th, and guided the Cubs to a 39-26 mark the rest of the way... "Sweet Swingin'" Billy Williams had a marvelous campaign with a .333 batting average, 37 home runs, 122 RBI, and 191 base hits to lead the team. Jim Hickman, Ron Santo, and Jose Cardenal each blasted 17 homers. Santo was second with 74 RBI while Cardenal had a team high 96 runs scored. Williams (95 runs scored) led the majors in hitting and slugging percentage (.606)...Ace Fergie Jenkins topped the hurlers with 20 wins, 184 strikeouts, 23 complete games, and five shutouts. Milt Pappas was a 17-game winner...Chicago won only three of fifteen meetings versus the Pirates...The Cubs fashioned the increasingly popular double knit, pullover jerseys and beltless pants for the first time...They hit 133 home runs as a team, including a .257 batting average. The staff's ERA was 3.22 for the season, fourth best in the N.L...Burt Hooton no-hit the Phillies at Wrigley Field, April 16th, on a chilly, damp, drizzly day in front of 9,583 fans. He struck out seven and walked seven batters in a 4-0 victory.
