"Le Grand Orange," Rusty Staub, had the most fans of all the Expos as well as 19 home runs and 97 RBI to lead the team. Bob Bailey was next on the ball club with 14 homers and 83 runs batted in...Bill Stoneman, with 17 victories, led the pitching staff which included three other double-digit winners: Steve Renko (15), Ernie McAnally (11), and Carl Morton (10). Stoneman whiffed 251 opposing hitters and completed nineteen games. Cerebral closer/ kinesiologist, and all-around odd ball, Mike Marshall, is beginning to gain notoriety as one of the game's best relievers with an arm that never seems to get fatigued. He finished 52 games out of the 'pen. Staff ERA: 4.12...The ball club bashed 88 homers and hit .246 for the season. Expos' batters, led by Ron Hunt's major league-leading FIFTY, topped the majors in hit batsmen with a total of seventy-eight. Hunt had 38 more than #2 Mike Epstein of the Senators and later the Athletics.
