Alvin Dark was fired from his dual role as Manager/General Manager of an abysmal Indians ball club at the end of July with a record of 42-61. Coach Johnny Lipon took over the reins and guided the team to an 18-41 mark. The Tribe was WORST in the American League with a 4.28 ERA, 747 runs, 154 home runs, and 770 bases on balls allowed. The pitching staff's number one starter, Sam McDowell, led the hurlers with 13 wins and 192 K's to go with a whopping 153 walks. Steve Dunning and Alan Foster both won eight games...Graig Nettles led a squad which hit .238 with 28 homers and 86 RBI. Roy Foster was second with 18 round trippers; Ray Fosse knocked home 62 runs. The Tribe hit 109 home runs as a team...Cleveland, with the worst attendance in the A.L.--just under 600,000 for the season--finished 43 games behind AL East Champion, Baltimore. The Indians won ONE season series, 9-3, versus the White Sox. They were 5-13 against the Orioles. The much-heralded Gabe Paul replaced Dark as the General Manager...Ken "Hawk" Harrelson, after suffering a broken leg during Spring Training, returned to the team but retired at mid-season to pursue a professional golfing career... Chris Chambliss was named the American League's Rookie of the Year.
