These are the A's of Charles O. Finley: The ball club with long hair and moustaches--"Rollie" Fingers waxed his well--and their inimitable owner riding around the field on a donkey named (what else?) Charlie O. before ball games. Whatever happened to those orange baseballs, Charlie? This was before Reggie Jackson ever dreamt of being "Mr. October" and a time when Vida Blue wanted to legally change his name to "True" Blue. The A's are on the rise...Finley's budding dynasty was swept in a heartbreaking ALCS by the Orioles, three games to none...Jackson slammed 32 homers, scored 87 runs, and totaled 157 base hits to lead the ball club. He collected 80 runs batted in. Sal Bando, second in A.L. MVP voting, slammed 24 home runs and led the team with 94 RBI. Rick Monday and Mike Epstein both socked 18 dingers. The A's hit .252 and 160 home runs for the year...Vida Blue won 24 games, lost eight, struck out 301 batters, completed 24 games, and tossed eight shutouts to lead the pitching staff. Blue was awarded the American League's Cy Young AND Most Valuable Player Awards. "Catfish" Hunter was a 21-game winner with sixteen complete games and four shutouts. He struck out 181 batters. Chuck Dobson won fifteen ball games while Diego Segui and "Blue Moon" Odom both won ten. Closer "Rollie" Fingers whiffed 98 opposing hitters. Oakland was second in the league with a 3.05 ERA...During the season, the A's scored 691 runs and allowed 564--the latter second fewest in the A.L...The series between the A's and Orioles during the regular schedule went in favor of The Birds, 7-4.
