The Giants won the NL West by just one game over their arch-rival, the Dodgers. San Francisco and Los Angeles had a hot battle all season long with the Giants appearing to have the title clinched when they led L. A. by 8 ½ games on September 1st. However, the Dodgers would go on an eight-game winning streak in the middle of the month (five of those wins over the Giants) and narrowed the gap to one game. On the season's final day, it took a Dave Kingman homer to defeat the Padres and finally capture the division crown. The season series favored the Dodgers, 12-6...Bobby Bonds was tops on the team with 33 round-trippers, 102 RBI, 178 base hits, and 110 runs scored. Dick Dietz was second in homers (19) and RBI (72). Willie McCovey and 40-year old Willie Mays both ended the year with 18 dingers. "Big Mac" drove in 70 runs; Mays had 61 runs batted in. The Giants hit .247 and 140 home runs...Juan Marichal won 18 games, struck out 159 batters, completed 18 games, and tossed four shutouts to lead the pitching staff. Gaylord Perry won 16 games with 158 K's and fourteen complete games. Reliever Jerry Johnson won twelve games out of the bullpen; Don McMahon added ten victories. The staff ERA was 3.32...The NL East champion Pirates captured the NLCS three games to one after they split the first two games at Candlestick Park with San Francisco. Bonds hit zero homers; McCovey and Mays combined for three.
