The '71 season is one most long-time Bosox fans have long forgotten: The Red Sox finished 18 games behind one of the best ball clubs in history (the '71 Orioles); however, the Bostons split the season series with Baltimore, 9-9. The Tigers were beaten 12 times in 18 contests, but the rapidly improving K. C. Royals won 11 of 12 regular season games...The Red Sox hit .252 as a team nary of any .300 hitters among the regular position players. Team leaders: Reggie Smith (30 homers, 96 RBI) and Rico Petrocelli (28 home runs, 89 RBI). George "Boomer" Scott knocked out 24 home runs and drove in seventy-eight. Carl Yastrzemski hit 15 homers with 70 runs batted in... "Sonny" Siebert was the pitching staff's top winner (16) while Ray Culp (14 wins) was tops in strikeouts with one hundred fifty-one. Gary Peters posted 14 victories. Jim Lonborg--appearing to be well recovered from a broken leg while skiing a few years before--was 10-7 with 100 K's...The Bosox hit 161 homers, second in the A.L...The staff ERA was 3.80 (tenth).
