Bobby Cox's 19th year (this his second stint as MGR) as the Braves bench-boss was not one of his most successful. The ball club never really challenged for the NL East title, and, after April, would come as close to first as a game out, in second place, with a 27-22 record, May 24th...Brian McCann, 24, was the team leader with 23 home runs and 87 RBI. "Chipper" Jones socked 22 homers and knocked in seventy-five. He led the team with 160 base hits while Kelly Johnson scored the most runs (86). Jones edged out the Cardinals' Albert Pujols by .007 of a point to earn the major leagues' highest batting average and the National League's batting crown. The Braves hit .270 and 130 home runs...The pitching staff finished twelfth in the league with a 4.46 ERA. Jair Jurrjens was the staff leader with his 13 wins and 139 strikeouts. Tim Hudson was an 11-game winner. John Smoltz, 41, missed most of the year but became the 16th pitcher in MLB history to reach 3,000 career strikeouts on April 22nd at home versus the Nationals.
