The Giants opened the season with Barry Bonds absent from the roster for the first time since 1993. He had not been tendered a contract after the '07 campaign. Four others were also missing from the line-up to start the year, among them starting shortstop Omar Vizquel. Surprisingly, catcher Bengie Molina led the ball club with 16 home runs and 95 RBI. Aaron Rowand followed with 13 dingers and 70 RBI. Randy Winn was the team leader in base hits (183) and runs scored (84). As a team, the Giants hit .262 for the season and were LAST in the N. L. in home runs (94)...Tim Lincecum won his first Cy Young Award after completing a season of domination with an 18-5 won/loss record and 265 strikeouts. The latter figure was a major league best as well as his strikeouts/per nine innings pitched (10.507). Matt Cain won eight games and whiffed 186 opponents. Barry Zito was a victor ten times. Closer Brian Wilson was second in the league in saves...Celebrating their 50th year in the Bay Area since relocating from New York prior to the '58 season, the Giants ended the year playing .500 ball versus NL West opposition (36-36)...Never expected to be a contender for the post-season, the team committed a horrendous 40 errors during Spring Training and even lost a game, 4-3, to the Fresno Grizzlies, their Triple A affiliate.
