Like their arch-rivals, the San Francisco Giants, the Dodgers marked their 50th year in L. A after moving to the West Coast from Brooklyn for the 1958 campaign. At the season's conclusion, they had won the NL West Division title for the first time since 2004 and advanced to the NLCS for the first time since the 1988 World Championship squad... As a team, the Dodgers hit 137 home runs led by Andre Ethier's twenty. Matt Kemp popped 18 homers and topped the ball club in base hits (176) and runs scored (93). A part of a three-team trade, Manny Ramirez arrived from Boston July 31st and clobbered 17 home runs to go with 53 RBI. James Loney's 90 RBI were the most on the team. The season ended with a .264 team batting average... Chad Billingsley won 16 games and struck out 201 as the leader of the pitching staff. Derek Lowe was next with 14 victories and 147 K's. The staff also posted the league's lowest ERA (3.68)... The Dodgers swept the Cubs in their NLDS draw in three games, but the Phillies proved to be a tougher beast to beat in the NLCS, a series Philly captured in five games. Ramirez hit .533 and swatted two home runs. Billingsley lost twice and allowed 11 runs (ten earned) on twelve hits in two starts.
