The 108<sup>th</sup> season the great city of Cleveland headed to the ball park to root on Chief Wahoo and the rest of The Tribe...Nagging, recurring injuries to Victor Martinez kept him out of the line-up for extended periods and the loss of starting pitcher Jake Westbrook for the year offered no relief. Roberto Hernandez (aka Fausto Carmona) with a bad hip and DH Travis Hafner (shoulder soreness) missed a great deal of playing time as well. After Game 81, the Indians were in fourth place of the AL Central at 37-44 and eight games out. The bottom fell out of the season in July but starting August 8<sup>th</sup>, the team started to regularly win ball games and ended the year a sparkling 31-17 from that point...Two vital players who had superlative seasons and were A. L. All Stars, Grady Sizemore (33 homers, 90 RBI, 170 base hits, 101 runs scored, 39 doubles) and A. L. Cy Young Award recipient Cliff Lee (22-3 W/L record, 170 K's) boosted the sagging hopes of the fans. Lee also was named the A. L. Comeback Player of the Year. He led the league in wins and ERA. Ryan Garko also drove home 90 runs while Jhonny Peralta was second with 23 home runs and led the team with 104 runs scored and 42 doubles...Team composite stats: BA (.262), home runs (171), ERA (4.45). C C Sabathia struck out 123 batters before he was traded to Milwaukee, July 7<sup>th</sup>...The Tribe was 36-36 versus division opponents.
