Expectations were high for the Brewers as they came off their first winning season since 1992. They opened the year 6-1 after the first seven games and would never see first place again after April 8th. At mid-season, they were 44-37 and in third 4 ½ games out of first. Bench coach Dale Sveum replaced Ned Yost in the manager's seat with twelve games to go in the season. Under Sveum, the Brewers were 7-5 and won the NL Wild Card spot--their first post-season appearance in 26 years. The Phillies, the eventual World Series champions, won the NLDS, three games to one... Ryan Braun led the "Brew Crew" with 37 homers, 106 RBI, 174 base hits, and 92 runs scored. Prince Fielder blasted 34 home runs and drove in 102 for the season. The team hit for a combined .253 average and hit for a lot of power--third in the N. L. with 198 home runs...Ben Sheets posted the most wins (13) and strikeouts (158). C C Sabathia was 11-2 in wins/losses with 128 K's. Jeff Suppan and Manny Parra both won ten games. The staff ERA was second in the league at 3.85...At the time of his departure, Yost had a decent 83-67 record.
