Highly regarded President of Baseball Operations, Andy MacPhail, of the famous baseball MacPhail Family, pulled the strings for the franchise on the field with the idea of obtaining good, young talent to mold into a contending ball club. The O's DID NOT contend in '08 in any way, but were able to reach second place in the AL East as late as May 8th. After Game #81, they were fourth and seven games out with a respectable 42-39 record. They fell to fifth place, July 23rd, and found a perch there the rest of the season. At that time, the Orioles were 10 ½ games out of first...They hit .267 as a team, good for 8th place in the league, and 172 home runs. Among the hitters, DH Aubrey Huff led the O's with 32 homers and 108 RBI. Both Luke Scott and Melvin Mora knocked out 23 round-trippers. Mora drove home 104 runs. Huff and Nick Markakis, 24, tied for the team lead with 182 base hits. Brian Roberts was tops in runs scored (106). Adam Jones, 22, spent his first season with the Orioles after being acquired from Seattle and demonstrated Gold Glove-style defense in centerfield to go with his nine home runs, 57 RBI, and excellent speed on the bases...Jeremy Guthrie (10 wins, 120 K's) led a pitching staff that finished 13th in the league with an alarming 5.13 ERA. Lefty Garrett Olson, 24, won all of nine ball games and whiffed eighty-three batters.
