After a very promising '07 season, the M's were expected to be even more competitive in '08. They fell flat on their faces. John McLaren was let go as manager, June 20th, with a 25-47 record. General Manager Bill Bavasi was also fired while Richie Sexson and Jose Vidro were released outright. Jim Riggleman would guide the ball club the remainder of the season to a 36-54 mark...Adrian Beltre led the team with 25 home runs. Raul Ibanez, who hit 23 dingers, knocked in 110 runs to lead the team. Beltre had 77 RBI. Jose Lopez was second on the team with 89 runs batted in. For the year, the Mariners hit .265 and 124 home runs...Twenty-two year old Felix Hernandez led the pitching staff with nine wins and 175 strikeouts. Erik Bedard and closer J. J. Putz followed with six victories apiece. Putz struck out 56 batters. The staff ERA was 4.73...Ichiro Suzuki's 213 hits led the M's and gave him EIGHT straight years with 200-plus base hits which tied Hall of Famer "Wee Willie" Keeler's all-time mark (1894-1901). Ichiro's 103 runs scored also led the ball club. On September 1st, Beltre hit for the cycle against the Rangers becoming the fourth Mariner to accomplish this rarity...Seattle would win only TWO season series over Cleveland (5-4) and Toronto (5-4). A team held to high expectations finished 39 games behind the first place Angels who won the season's meetings, 14-5.
