For the second straight season, the Mets were knocked from a possible post-season berth by the Marlins on the final day of the regular schedule. They also fell short of a Wild Card spot by one game to the Brewers. New York dropped twelve of the last seventeen games to eliminate themselves from the playoffs...During their 45th and last season calling Shea Stadium home, the Mets hit .266 as a team and 172 home runs. Carlos Delgado walloped 38 homers to lead the team. David Wright followed with 33 round-trippers and topped the ball club in RBI (124). Delgado was second with 115 runs knocked in. Jose Reyes was the leader in base hits (204) and put up a "triple double": 37 doubles, 19 triples, and 16 home runs. Carlos Beltran (27 homers, 112 RBI) scored the most runs (116)...The ace of the pitching staff, Johan Santana, claimed the most wins (16) and strikeouts (206). Mike Pelfrey won thirteen games while Oliver Perez and John Maine were ten-game winners. Perez was second to Santana in strikeouts (180). Closer Billy Wagner whiffed 52 batters and walked only ten all season. The staff ERA (4.07) placed them sixth in the N. L....The Mets were on a West Coast road trip when rumors became more pronounced that manager Willie Randolph would be fired. The ax finally came after a 9-6 win in Anaheim against the Angels, June 16th. At the time, the ball club was in third place, 34-35, and 6 1/2 games out of first. Jerry Manuel was named interim manager and guided the team to a 55-38 mark the rest of the year. Manuel, retained for 2009, had been Randolph's bench coach.
