"The Fish" could really swing from "the dish." They were second in the N. L. with 208 homers (the team batting average was .254, 11th). Hanley Ramirez smacked the highest number (33) while Dan Uggla and Mike Jacobs BOTH slammed thirty-two. Add Jorge Cantu's twenty-nine and Cody Ross's twenty-two and that's about 71 percent of the team's home runs. Cantu led the Marlins in RBI (95); Ramirez was tops with 177 base hits and 125 runs scored...Ricky Nolasco's fifteen victories were the most on the pitching staff along with his 186 strikeouts. Scott Olsen was next with eight wins and 113 K's. The staff ERA of 4.43 placed them eleventh in the league...The Marlins spent a bit of time in first or tied for that spot from May 6th through the 28th. Their largest lead was three games on May 11th. At the season's mid-point Florida's record stood at 42-39, a game out and in second place. They dropped to third place, August 8th for the remainder of the year and finished 7 ½ games out. Versus division rivals their record was 40-31, a dominating 14-3 against the Nationals.
