**The Angels ended the year with the best record in the major leagues, but were swept from the post-season after three games in the ALDS by the eventual American League Champion Kansas City Royals...The Halos and Royals split their regular season series, 3-3...Mike Trout was named the American League MVP after completing a monster season: 36 home runs, 111 RBI, and 115 runs scored. He was second on the team with 173 base hits. Albert Pujols was next after slamming 28 homers and driving home one-hundred five. Howie Kendrick led the team with 181 hits and drove in 75 runs. Kole Calhoun had a break-out year with seventeen dingers and 90 runs scored. As a team, the Angels hit .259 and 155 homers. They led the A.L in runs scored with 773...Jered Weaver was the leader of the pitching staff with an 18-9 W/L record and 169 strikeouts. Matt Shoemaker was 16-4 while C. J. Wilson and Garrett Richards ended the season winners of thirteen games. Richards had 164 K's and the lefty, Wilson, 151 strikeouts. The staff posted a 3.58 ERA and gave up the fewest homers in the A.L. (126)...On September 9<sup>th</sup>, the Angels won their 89<sup>th</sup> game of the year which made them the second post-1960s expansion team to finish a season with an all-time winning record for the franchise. The Astros previously met the standard in 2006.**
