It could be said the Astros suffered through their version of “The Dark Ages” from 2009 to 2013, a record of 312-498. In 2014, they finished out of the cellar for the first time since 2010. Manager “Bo” Porter was replaced by Tom Lawless, September 1st, with the Astros holding a 59-79 record. Lawless finished the year 11-13...Chris Carter was the team leader with 37 home runs and 88 runs batted in. George Springer followed with 20 dingers while Jose Altuve was second with 59 RBI. Altuve collected 47 doubles for the year and was the Astros’ leader with 225 hits and 85 runs scored. The ball club hit .242 and 163 home runs...Lefty Dallas Keuchel led the pitching staff with twelve wins. He posted 147 strikeouts. Righty Collin McHugh was a winner eleven times and led the staff with 157 K’s. Jarrod Cosart won nine ball games. The staff ended the season with a 4.11 ERA.
