The O's finished the month of May at .500 (15-15) and by June 6th, a loss to Oakland placed them 6 ½ games out of first in the AL East. That was the farthest they would be from the top spot the rest of the year. By the end of June, the Orioles were just one game in back of the front-running Blue Jays. On September 16th, the ball club claimed their first AL East title since 1997, swept the Tigers in the ALDS, but were swept by the Royals in the ALCS. Adam Jones completed the year with a team high 181 hits and 88 runs scored. He cracked 29 homers. Nelson Cruz led the majors with 40 home runs and the O's with 108 RBI. Stellar backstop Matt Wieters, off to his finest start at the plate, was lost for the remainder of the season after "Tommy John" surgery on his throwing arm in June. Manny Machado, returning from left knee surgery, was just coming into his own when he tore up the right knee late in the season and was not available for the playoffs. Chris Davis (26 homers) was ineligible for the post-season. The Birds hit .256 for the year and led the majors in homers (211). It was the team's third straight year hitting 200 or more home runs in a season. Wei-Yin Chen led the O's with 16 victories. Chris Tillman (13 wins) was the leader of the pitching staff in strikeouts (150). "Bud" Norris won fifteen and lost eight. The staff was third in the A.L. in ERA (3.43). They led the league with 53 saves.
