Clayton Kershaw led the majors in earned run average and wins (21). He struck out 239 batters. "The Claw" won the N.L. Cy Young Award, was named N.L. MVP and no-hit the Rockies at Dodger Stadium, June 18th. He struck out 15 batters in the ball game...Zack Greinke was 17-8 with 207 punch outs. Josh Beckett was just 6-6 for the season but was outstanding enough to no-hit the Phillies in Philadelphia, May 25th, for his first career "no-no". Lefty Hyun-jin Ryu won fourteen games and Dan Haren thirteen. Closer Kenley Jansen whiffed 101 batters. The Dodgers had the fourth best ERA in the N.L. (3.40) and led the league in strikeouts (1,373)...Adrian Gonzalez led the Dodgers' with 27 homers and the N.L. with 116 RBI. Dee Gordon topped the team in hits (176) and tied Yasiel Puig with 92 runs scored. Puig popped 16 home runs while Hanley Ramirez added thirteen. Matt Kemp blasted 25 dingers to go with 89 RBI and 38 doubles. L.A. was second in the N.L. with a .265 batting average, sixth with 134 home runs and led the N.L. in stolen bases (138). At the All Star break the Dodgers were in first place by a half-game with a record of 54-43. After dropping briefly to second, they took over first place for the rest of the year on July 27th...L. A. met the Cardinals in the NLDS where Kershaw lost two games and put up a 7.82 ERA in nearly 13 innings of work. The Dodgers were eventually eliminated from post-season play, three games to one.
