The Braves opened the season with a 12-1 record--their best start since '94. Included were ten straight victories in their first ten games. On April 13<sup>th</sup>, they were alone in first place of the NL East and remained there the remainder of the season. The ball club also won 14 straight games from July 26<sup>th</sup> through August 9<sup>th</sup>. Justin Upton was the team leader with 27 homers and 94 runs scored. All Star Freddie Freeman socked 23 home runs and led the team with 109 RBI, and 176 base hits. Fan favorite Evan Gattis slugged 21 homers and knocked in 65 runs. Dan Uggla hit 22 dingers while Brian McCann, who replaced an injured Freeman as a member of the N.L. squad, cracked 20 home runs. They hit a composite .249 for the year and led the league with 181 home runs...On the pitching rubber, the team's top winner was Kris Medlen with 15 victories. Mike Minor (13-9) was tops with 181 strikeouts. Julio Teheran ended the season 14-8 and racked up 170 K's. Paul Maholm was 10-11 in wins/losses. Closer Craig Kimbrell was simply wicked as he collected 98 strikeout victims and tied the Orioles' Jim Johnson for the major league lead in saves. The staff posted the lowest ERA in the league (3.18)...The Braves' season ended with a three games to one loss to the Dodgers in the NLDS.
