The Rays most valuable player, Evan Longoria, led the ball club with 32 homers, 88 RBI, 91 runs scored, and 39 doubles. Matt Joyce followed with 18 dingers while Kelly Johnson was good for sixteen. Ben Zobrist had a team high 168 base hits. James Loney was second with 75 RBI. The Rays hits .257 for the year and 165 home runs...Lefty Matt Moore topped the pitching staff with a 17-4 record. He had 143 K's. David Price (11-8) had the most strikeouts (151) and complete games (four). Jeremy Hellickson ended the year with twelve wins and Alex Cobb was 11-3 in wins/losses. Cobb whiffed 134 batters. Their ERA was fifth in the A.L. (3.74)...After 81 games, the Rays were in fourth place with a 42-39 record six games out of first. From June 29th through July 26th they went 19-3 to take the top spot by one-half game. They slipped back to second (with just a handful of days sitting in first place) and finished the year winning ten of fourteen to tie Texas for the second Wild Card spot. The Rays knocked off the Rangers on the road in a "163rd game", 5-2, to move on to the Wild Card Game where they shutout the Indians, 4-0, at Progressive Field. The Red Sox were up next in the ALDS where the Rays' express was stopped in four games. Tampa Bay quickly got into a hole in the series by trailing two games to none. They won Game Three at Tropicana Field but then were eliminated by Boston, 3-1, in the finale. James Loney hit .417 in the series but Longoria was held to two hits in thirteen at bats. Moore gave up eight runs in his start while Price yielded seven in seven innings pitched in Game Two. In the ALDS, the staff ERA was 6.35...The Rays were outscored 26 -12.
