The Red Sox posted one of their best seasons ever as they simply rolled through the schedule after taking over first place in the AL East on April 18th and never relinquishing that position. The Bosox compiled the league's best record and swept the upstart Colorado Rockies in the World Series, 4-0. Dustin Pedroia struggled mightily at the plate to start the season--and strongly faced a demotion to the minors--but recovered superbly and won the AL Rookie of the Year Award. Jacoby Ellsbury (who would become one of the best young players in the majors and greatly helped THIS team reach its post-season success) made his major league debut, June 30th, going one for four at the plate...One can't forget the guy in left field named Ramirez ("Manny being Manny") drawing attention to himself ON and OFF the field... Team leaders: "Big Papi" led the ball club with 35 home runs (he knocked in 117); Mike Lowell topped the Red Sox with 120 RBI. Lowell also hit 21 home runs while Manny Ramirez blasted 20 homers and drove in 88 runs. Josh Beckett led the pitching staff with a 20-7 W/L record. Daisuke Matsuzaka (15-12) topped the hurlers with 201 K's. Beckett whiffed 194 batters. Knuckleballer Tim Wakefield was 17-12 for the season...The Bosox swept the Angels in the ALDS, and eliminated the Indians, 4-3, after falling behind three games to one, in the ALCS...The Red Sox hit .279, 166 home runs, and led the league with 352 doubles. The pitching staff turned in the league's best ERA at 3.87. Closer Jonathan Papelbon whiffed 84 batters.
