Chicago's U. S. Cellular Field was the site of Mark Buehrle's first career no-hitter on April 18<sup>th</sup>. For his first win of the season, Buehrle struck out eight and walked only one Texas Rangers batter, Sammy Sosa, in the fifth inning. Minutes later, Buehrle picked Sosa off first allowing him to face the minimum number of batters (27). It was also the first no-no in the White Sox current home ball park. Some 25,390 fans witnessed history in a game played in 40 degree weather. The Chisox never contended for the AL Central title; they were 3 ½ games out and in third place, May 22<sup>nd</sup>, with a record of 23-19. They played .408 ball (49-71) after that date...Buehrle won ten and dropped nine in '07 while Javier Vazquez enjoyed a campaign with a sharp 15-8 record and staff-leading 213 strikeouts. Closer Bobby Jenks tied for fifth in the majors in saves. Jon Garland and Jose Contreras both won ten games. The staff ERA was 4.77, 12<sup>th</sup> in the league...White Sox batters hit .246 for the season and 190 home runs, the latter mark second in the A. L. DH Jim Thome clobbered his 500<sup>th</sup> career homer and led the Sox with thirty-five. He racked up the most RBI (96) and runs scored (79). Paul Konerko followed with 31 taters and 90 RBI. He led the ball club in base hits (142). Jermaine Dye popped 28 dingers; Josh Fields added 23 and Juan Uribe 20.
