The Mets' collapse and the Phillies' rally near season's end allowed the latter to win the NL East. During spring training, Jimmy Rollins boastfully declared: "We're the team to beat"...The Phils ended the season's first half at 44-44. In late August, the ball club went on a six-game winning streak, including a four-game sweep of the Mets at home. During September, the Phillies went 17-10 with another six-game winning streak in the midst of it all AND a three-game sweep of the Mets in New York. Meanwhile, the team from Gotham, who had a seven-game lead in the NL East as late as September 12th, won only five of its last seventeen games allowing the Phils to capture the division crown. It took a Mets loss to the Marlins and a Phillies victory over the Nationals on the season's final day to clinch the title. Rollins was true to his word...The Rockies swept the Phils in the playoffs' opening round...Rollins was the N.L. MVP Award recipient and won a Gold Glove Award to go with it...Ryan Howard led the Phillies with a whopping 47 home runs and 136 RBI. "J-Roll" put up a "triple double" with 38 doubles, 20 triples, and 30 home runs. Rollins drove in 94 runs and led the ball club with 212 hits and 139 runs scored. Pat Burrell also slammed 30 homers and drove home 97 runs. Chase Utley chipped in with 103 RBI, 22 homers, and 48 doubles. Aaron Rowand hit 27 dingers, 45 doubles, scored 105 runs, and drove in eighty-nine. He also won a Gold Glove. For the year, the Phils hit .274 and 213 homers...Cole Hamels led the pitching staff with a 15-5 record and 177 strikeouts. Jamie Moyer posted a 14-12 record while Adam Eaton and Kyle Kendrick were both 10-game winners. Closer Brett Myers whiffed 83 batters. The staff finished thirteenth in the N.L. with a 4.73 ERA.
