Oft-injured starter Ben Sheets opened the season with a two-hit shutout over the Dodgers. Within days, the Brewers would jump into the top spot of the NL Central (April 21st) and would claim that post solely to themselves through August 16th. A loss to the Reds August 17th dropped them a half-game behind the Cubs. The rest of the season was a nip-and-tuck struggle with Chicago who won the division by two games. The Brewers and Cubs were not scheduled to meet head-to-head in September...Milwaukee's 231 home runs led the league; they hit .262 as a team. Prince Fielder led the senior circuit with 50 homers and the ball club in RBI (119), base hits (165), and runs scored (109). N. L. Rookie of the Year Ryan Braun was next with 34 homers, 97 RBI, and 91 runs scored. J. J. Hardy and Corey Hart mashed 50 home runs combined...Three pitchers all won twelve ball games: Sheets, Jeff Suppan, and Dave Bush. Bush struck out 134 batters to lead the staff. Claudio Vargas added eleven victories. The hurlers ended the season with a 4.41 ERA placing them ninth in the league...The Tigers Justin Verlander no-hit Milwaukee on June 12th, part of a streak which saw the Brewers drop 20 of 30 games. Despite this speed-bump, the "Brew Crew" maintained a 5 ½ game lead in the division, down from eight May 12th.
