The Angels jumped alone into first place on April 26th with a 12-10 record and remained there the rest of the '07 campaign with the exception of one day, May 8th, when they were tied following a loss to Cleveland. They were 29 games over .500, September 20th, and had fashioned an AL West lead of 9 ½ games (both season highs). Anaheim won the division by six games over Seattle, but would be eliminated from the playoffs in a three-game sweep by the Red Sox (the same club which had ended the Angels season in the exact way in 2004). The Halos were outscored 19-4 in the series and did not hit a home run...Vlad Guerrero was the team leader with 27 homers, 127 RBI, and 45 doubles. Gary Matthews, Jr. swatted 18 dingers; Garret Anderson contributed 16 to the Angels total of 123 for the year. Orlando Cabrera had the most base hits (192) and runs scored (101). He drove in 86 runs. Anaheim hit a composite .284, fourth in the A. L...John Lackey (19 wins, 179 strikeouts) and Kelvim Escobar (18 wins, 160 K's) were the default leaders of the pitching staff. Jered Weaver added thirteen victories. Closer Frankie Rodriguez tied two others for the fifth most saves in the majors. The staff ERA ended the year at 4.23, fifth in the league.
