Tigers Notes: Justin Verlander tossed a no-hitter against the Brewers, June 12th, the first at Comerica Park and since Jack Morris's no-no in 1984. In the game, Verlander struck out twelve and walked four...On September 7th, Curtis Granderson became the sixth player in major league history to compile a 20-20-20 season: 38 doubles, 23 triples, and 23 home runs. Two days later, Granderson stole his 20th base to become the third player in MLB annals to collect at least 20 extra-base hits (2B, 3B, HR) and 20 stolen bases in a season. (The Phillies Jimmy Rollins joined Granderson in attaining the same feat later in the year.)...Team leaders: Magglio Ordonez (28 home runs, 139 RBI, 216 base hits). Ordonez's batting average was a major league-best along with his 54 doubles. DH Gary Sheffield swatted 25 homers; Carlos Guillen popped 21 and drove in 102 runs. The Tigers were second in the A. L. with a .287 batting average and sixth with 177 home runs...Verlander won 18 and lost 6; his 183 strikeouts were the most on the pitching staff. Jeremy Bonderman finished 11-9 with 145 K's. The staff ERA was 4.57, ranking them ninth in the league...The defending American League champions finished eight games in back of AL Central kingpin Cleveland and failed to reach the post-season...Their record versus division foes was 36-36...Ordonez was runner-up in league MVP voting.
