The 2007 season was a season of several "firsts" for the D-Rays. Andy Sonnanstine set a team record with seven consecutive strikeouts in a win over the Marlins, June 10<sup>th</sup>. Carlos Pena broke the ball club's records for home runs and RBI in a season. Delmon Young became the first Rays' player to take the field for all 162 games. Scott Kazmir became the first Rays' pitcher to reach at least 200 strikeouts in a year. Finally, Tampa Bay introduced new primary uniform colors: Green and Black...Two youngsters, "B. J." Upton and Brendan Harris, produced very promising seasons. Upton won the centerfield job and went on to hit 24 homers and drive in 82 runs. Harris started at shortstop and socked 12 homers as well as 35 doubles. Pena led the Rays with 46 home runs, 121 RBI and 99 runs scored. Young led the team in hits (186) and knocked in 93 runs. Speedster Carl Crawford had 80 RBI and was tied for the league lead in steals. The D-Rays were seventh in the A.L. with a .268 batting average and third with 187 home runs...James Shields, in his second major league season, was 12-8 with 184 strikeouts. Kazmir led the staff with 13 wins and 239 K's. Sonnanstine and reliever Gary Glover both won six contests. The staff ERA was 5.53, the WORST in the majors...The D-Rays scored 782 runs and allowed 944 for the year...Skipper Joe Maddon's option years through 2009 were picked up by the ball club in September...This was the last season the Tampa Bay franchise would be referred to as the "Devil Rays." No one knew 2008 was going to be a REMARKABLE year.
