The Tribe tied the Red Sox for the best record in the big leagues and made their first post-season appearance since winning the AL Central division in 2001. After defeating the Yankees in the ALDS, three games to one, the Indians lost a hard fought ALCS to the eventual World Champion Red Sox, four games to three. The Tribe at one time had a 3-1 lead in the series. (Cleveland had won two of seven games between the two during the regular season.)... Victor Martinez led the ball club with 25 home runs and 114 RBI. Grady Sizemore and Travis Hafner each hit 24 homers. Hafner was second on the team with 100 runs batted in while Sizemore was the team leader with 174 hits and 118 runs scored. Ryan Garko and Jhonny Peralta both popped 21 home runs. Peralta knocked in 72 runs and Casey Blake added 18 dingers for the season. The Tribe hit .268 and 178 home runs...Two nineteen-game winners headlined the pitching staff: C C Sabathia and Fausto Carmona (formerly known as Roberto Hernandez). Sabathia led the staff with 209 strikeouts; Carmona followed with 137 K's. Paul Byrd was a double-digit winner as well with 15 victories. Closer Joe Borowski led the American League with 45 saves. Smoke-throwing reliever Rafael Betancourt struck out 80 batters and walked only nine for the season. Lefty Rafael Perez almost copied Betancourt's numbers (62 K's, 15 walks). The staff ERA was 4.05, third in the league... By the All Star break, the Indians were 52-36 and one game out of first place. They took over the top spot for good, August 17th, with a 2-1 win at Tampa Bay. Their record stood at 67-54.
