The three-time defending NL West Champion Padres nearly made it four straight in '07. (The team spent 43 days in first place, the last September 4th.) At the end of the regular schedule, they were tied with the Rockies for both the NL Wild Card and second place in the division. A tie-breaker game was needed to settle the issue; the Rockies won the game which dropped the Padres not only to third (1 ½ out) but completely out of the playoff picture. At Coors Field, the contest went thirteen innings--and nearly five hours--before the hometown "nine" prevailed, 9-8...San Diego was second-to-last in league batting (.251) and seventh in home runs (171). Adrian Gonzalez was by far the team leader in homers (30), RBI (100), base hits (182), runs scored (101), and doubles (46). Khalil Greene was a surprising second with 27 dingers and 97 runs batted in. Mike Cameron drilled 21 homers and drove home seventy-eight...The pitching staff was at the top of the list in league ERA (3.70). Jake Peavy led the N. L. with 19 wins and the majors in ERA (2.54) to garner the N. L. Cy Young Award. He lost only six games. His 240 strikeouts also topped the big leagues. Greg Maddux, 41, won 14 ball games while Chris Young added ten victories...Within the division, the Padres were 40-33.
