**Yankees Notes:** During the off-season, the Yanks family suffered the tragic loss of pitcher Cory Lidle when the private plane he was piloting crashed into a NYC skyscraper. In April, three of the Yankees five starters (including Mike Mussina and Chien-Ming Wang) weren't available due to injury and would not rejoin the rotation until early May. However, Alex Rodriguez tied Albert Pujols for the most home runs hit in April (14). The Yanks also struggled through a seven-game losing streak and finished the month 9-14. When May ended, the Yankees (22-29, 13 ½ games behind Boston) found themselves in a very strange position--last place with the Devil Rays. On May 6<sup>th</sup>, Roger Clemens announced at The Stadium he was going to join the team again. He made his debut June 9<sup>th</sup> and beat the Pirates. Through July and August, the ball club went 37-20 and were in second, five games out. On August 4<sup>th</sup>, "A-Rod" mashed his 500<sup>th</sup> career homer. The Yankees clinched the American League Wild Card, September 27<sup>th</sup>, and faced off with the Indians who eliminated New York in the ALDS, 3-1..."The Bronx Bombers" showed their mettle leading the A. L. in hitting (.290) and homers (201). Rodriguez was the king in the majors in four categories: Home runs (54), RBI (156), runs scored (143), and OPS (1.067). He was also the A. L. MVP. Hideki Matsui followed with 25 homers and 103 RBI...Wang would come back a put up a 19-7 W/L record. Andy Pettitte went 15-9 and led the pitching staff in strikeouts (141). Mussina was an eleven-game winner. Premier closer Mariano Rivera blew two saves in April and didn't return to his usual form until well into the season. He didn't place in the top ten in the majors in saves. The staff ERA was 4.49, ranking them eighth in the league.
