The Twins played their first season under the roof of the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome...The ball club drew just over 921,000 spectators into its new digs--last in the American League...The main reason: The Twins were pretty awful. Even though catcher Sal Butera threw out FOUR Yankee would-be base stealers in a game May 29th (the only time that's happened in the ball club's history), the Twins, as a team, posted a decrepit 3-26 record for that month. This was the worst record for ANY month since the Philadelphia Athletics went 2-28 in June, 1916...During this time, the Twins lost a team record 14 straight games until a shutout victory over the Orioles on June 4th...Team leaders: Gary Ward (28 homers, 91 RBI, 165 base hits, 85 runs scored) and Kent Hrbek (23 home runs, 92 RBI, 160 hits, 82 runs scored). Third baseman Gary Gaetti cracked 25 dingers and drove in eighty-four. Tom Brunansky was good for 20 home runs to add to the total of 148 circuit clouts the ball club hit for the season. The Twins were tenth in the A.L. with a .257 batting average...Starter Bobby Castillo (13-11 W/L record, 123 K's) and fellow starter Brad Havens (10-14 record, 129 strikeouts) were the leaders of the pitching staff. Albert Williams was a nine-game winner while lefty Jack O'Connor rounded out the starting staff with an eight-win season. Closer Ron Davis whiffed 89 batters. Young lefthander Frank Viola was 4-10 after making his big league debut in June. Pitcher Terry Felton's career ended in '82 with a personal W/L mark of 0-16--the major league record for futility on the mound. (He was 0-3 in '80 and 0-13 in '82.) The pitching staff was LAST in the league with a 4.72 ERA...For the year, the Twins scored 657 runs and allowed 819...They did not win a single season series but split with the Red Sox, 6-6. Their record against the Yankees was 2-10.
