The White Sox ended the campaign just six games in back of the Indians in the AL Central. Chicago won only five of the twelve games during their season series with the Tribe. The Pale Hose dominated Kansas City, however, eleven games to one...Albert "Joey" Belle, who joined the White Sox during the off-season after inking a five-year, 55-million dollar free agent contract, popped 30 homers, drove in 116 runs, and collected 45 doubles and 174 base hits. Frank Thomas led the ball club with 35 dingers, 184 base hits, 110 runs scored and 125 RBI. Even with those two elite sluggers, the Sox were tenth in the AL after blasting 158 homers. They were sixth in the league with a .273 team batting average...White Sox pitchers posted a 4.73 ERA (ninth) and finished second with 52 saves. Doug Drabek and James Baldwin topped the staff after both put up twelve wins. Jaime Navarro (9-14 W/L) whiffed 142 batters to lead the hurlers. Before being dealt to the Giants at the trading deadline, southpaw Wilson Alvarez went 9-8 with 110 K's. Baldwin struck out one hundred forty batters.
