With the nightmare that was the 2003 season behind them, the Tigers improved their win total by 29 games in 2004. The ball club even set a major league record in spacious/pitcher-friendly Comerica Park with 11 players each slugging at least 10 home runs. Detroit ended the year fifth in the A.L. in batting average (.272), home runs (201), and first in triples (54). Carlos Pena was the team leader with 27 homers. Shortstop Carlos Guillen hit for a "triple double": 37 doubles, 10 triples, and 20 home runs. He led the ball club in runs scored (97) and RBI (97). Catcher Ivan Rodriguez hit 19 dingers and led the Tigers in base hits (176). Eric Munson and Rondell White both finished the season with 19 homers as well...Jeremy Bonderman topped the pitching staff with 168 strikeouts. Nate Robertson was the staff leader with 12 victories while Bonderman and Mike Maroth both won eleven. (Maroth had been a 21-game loser the year before.) Robertson was second with 155 K's. An ERA of 4.93 placed the Tigers' staff thirteenth in the A.L...With all that, they still finished 20 games behind the AL Central champion Twins who won the season's meetings, 12-7...Future ace Justin Verlander was drafted by the Tigers in the first round of the amateur draft with the second overall pick.
