The Rangers enjoyed a real nice season in '90, but the accolades primarily go to Nolan Ryan. "The Express" became the oldest pitcher (43-years-old) to throw a no-hitter (#6) when he beat the Athletics in Oakland, June 11th. During the game, he struck out fourteen and walked two batters. He picked up his 300th career win against the Brewers, July 31st after he gave up six hits, three runs, and two walks. He struck out eight in the ball game...Pete Incaviglia led the team with 25 home runs. He drove in 85 for the season. Ruben Sierra was tops with 96 RBI and added sixteen homers. Rafael Palmeiro led the A.L. in base hits (191) and drove home 89 runs. The Rangers' only All Star, Julio Franco, topped the ball club with 96 runs scored. He was named the All Star Game's MVP after striking a two-run double in the seventh inning which proved to be the margin of victory for the A.L., 2-0. During the regular season, Franco hit 11 dingers and had 172 base knocks. The Rangers hit .259 and 110 home runs...Starter Bobby Witt led the pitching staff with 17 wins and seven complete games. Ryan added 13 victories to go with a staff leading 232 strikeouts. Charlie Hough was 12-12 for the year while Kevin Brown finished 12-10 with six complete games. Lefty Kenny Rogers was a ten-game winner out of the bullpen. The staff ended the season sixth in the A.L. in ERA (3.83)...By the All Star break, Texas was in sixth place with a 40-44 record and twelve games out of first place.
