The Angels fourth year in the American League resulted in the ball club finishing seventeen games behind the pennant-winning Yankees and just three behind fourth place Detroit. They were a composite 30-42 versus the teams finishing above them in the standings. After April 29th, the closest the Halos came to first place was 9 ½ games, in fourth place, as late as July 23rd holding a 50-49 record...Team leaders: Joe Adcock (21 homers) and Jim Fregosi (72 RBI, 140 base hits, 86 runs scored, 22 doubles). Fregosi was second with 18 dingers...The American League's Cy Young Award winner, Dean Chance, topped the pitching staff with a 20-9 won/loss mark. He also led the hurlers in strikeouts (207), complete games (15), and shutouts (11). His ERA was the best in baseball. He finished fifth in MVP voting. Fred Newman was a thirteen-game winner while reliever Bob Lee was second after ringing up 111 K's...Angels batters hit .242 for the year to go with 102 home runs. The staff was second in the A.L. in ERA (2.91) and first with 17 shutouts...Vic Power was awarded a Gold Glove for outstanding play at first base.
