The White Sox opened the new Comiskey Park, April 18th, with a 16-0 loss to the Tigers after beginning the season with a 6-1 record on the road. The Tigers hit four home runs and had 19 hits in the ball game. The new ball park still featured the "exploding" scoreboard with fireworks and spinning pin-wheels after a White Sox player slams a home run and following each Sox victory. Also retained was the shower fans could utilize during hot Windy City summers in its usual spot near the centerfield bleachers...The White Sox hit .262 for the season and finished seventh with 139 homers. Leading the way was "The Big Hurt," Frank Thomas, who clobbered 32 taters, drove in 109 runs, had 178 base hits, and scored 104 times. Robin Ventura followed with 23 dingers and 100 RBI. Carlton Fisk and Dan Pasqua both popped 18 homers. Tim "Rock" Raines was second to Thomas with 102 runs...The Sox hurlers ended the year fourth in the A.L. with a 3.79 ERA and led the league with 28 complete games. Ace Jack McDowell was the top winner with a 17-10 W/L record, 191 strikeouts, fifteen complete games, and three shutouts. Lefty Greg Hibbard was 11-11 and free-agent pick-up Charlie Hough posted a 9-10 record. Alex Fernandez won nine ball games while reliever Melido Perez whiffed 128 batters...Chicago spent 13 days in first as late as April 28th. Their high mark for the rest of the season was reaching 20-games over .500, August 11th, in second place just one game out of the top spot in the AL Central.
