The Redlegs got off to a very good start and found themselves tied for first in the NL Central with a 34-25 record, June 9th. At the All Star break they were 47-41 and in third place 7 ½ games out. They would not come near the top spot again...Adam Dunn led the team with 46 homers, 102 RBI, and 105 runs scored. Sean Casey (24 home runs) led the team in hits (185) and tallied 101 runs. He collected 99 RBI. Wily Mo Pena added 26 dingers and 66 RBI; Ken Griffey, Jr. hit 20 twenty round-trippers. As a team, the Reds hit .250 and 194 homers...Number One starter Paul Wilson (117 K's) led the pitching staff with eleven wins. Aaron Harang was 10-9 with 125 strikeouts. Cory Lidle won seven ball games. The staff ERA of 5.19 was the WORST in the majors...Cincinnati finished the year 29 games behind the NL Central champion Cardinals and thirteen in back of the third place Cubs.
