First baseman Rod Carew, the Twins lone All Star, won his seventh American League batting title and led the team with 188 base hits and 85 runs scored. Carew celebrated his twelfth All Star appearance with TWO triples in the game played at San Diego Stadium. Roy Smalley topped the Twins with 19 homers. He walked FIVE times during a win over Baltimore and was officially one for one while scoring three runs in the game. Smalley also had 160 hits and 77 RBI. Dan Ford was the leader with 82 RBI and completed a "triple double": 36 two-baggers, 10 triples, and 11 home runs for the season. He was second on the team with 162 base hits. The Twins were fourth in the A.L. with a .267 batting average but LAST in the league with 82 home runs... Starter Dave Goltz posted the most wins on the pitching staff with fifteen while Roger Erickson and Geoff Zahn each logged 14 victories. Erickson led the hurlers with 121 strikeouts and fourteen complete games. Goltz pitched thirteen complete games and led the staff with two shutouts. Reliever Mike Marshall was picked up in May and won ten games out of the 'pen. He struck out 56 batters. The staff ERA was tenth in the league (3.69)... The Twins drew just under 800,000 spectators to Metropolitan Stadium. They finished 19 games behind AL West Division champ Kansas City. However, the Twins WON the season series between the two clubs, 8-7.
