The second edition of the Blue Jays finished twelfth in the American League with a .250 team batting average and eleventh with 98 home runs. Leading the ball club was big bopper and very reliable first baseman John Mayberry, Sr. after he walloped 22 homers and drove home seventy. Close behind was designated hitter Rico Carty with 20 dingers and 68 RBI. They were the only two to reach double-digit figures in home runs. Speedy outfielder Bob Bailor topped the Jays in base hits (164), runs scored (74), and doubles (29)...The pitching corps concluded the season thirteenth in the A. L. with a 4.54 ERA. Jim Clancy led the staff with ten wins. Jesse Jefferson and reliever Victor Cruz both followed with seven victories. Clancy struck out 106 batters, second to Tom Underwood's 139 K's. Jefferson completed nine games to lead the staff. The hard-throwing Cruz had 51 punch outs...Toronto won just one more game than they did in their freshman season. Versus AL East competition they produced a 28-61 record. The Jays won TWO season series: 6-4 against the White Sox and 7-4 versus Texas...Toronto put 24 runs on the scoreboard with 24 base hits, June 26th, against the Orioles at Exhibition Stadium. Mayberry, Dave McKay, Otto Velez, and Brian Milner ALL had three hits in the game. (Milner played in only two games with nine at bats.) Both Bailor and Velez scored four runs; Mayberry had seven RBI. All the Jays runs were scored in the second through fifth innings.
