After a rocky start (the Brewers were in fifth place, June 7th, with a 26-26 record and 8 ½ games out of first) Milwaukee reeled off a ten-game winning streak from June 9th through June 17th to prevent falling too far behind the other AL East contenders by the All Star break. At the mid-season recess, the "Brew Crew" had pulled themselves up to second but were now nine full games out. For the remainder of the year, the Brewers went 45-34 and made it as close to first with a 4 ½ game deficit on September 24th. They finished 6 ½ games behind the division champion Yankees. Milwaukee WON the season series versus New York, 10-5, and went 43-32 against the rest of the AL East...The Brewers, who came to be referred to as "Bambi's Bombers," led both major leagues with 173 homers and a .276 team batting average. (The big league averages were 114 homers and a .258 BA.) Larry Hisle was the leader of the ball club with 34 home runs, 115 RBI, and 96 runs scored. "Stormin' Gorman" Thomas was next with 32 round-trippers and 86 runs batted in. Former Oakland captain, Sal Bando, 34, led the team in base hits (154) and added 17 dingers and 78 RBI. Ben Oglivie popped 18 homers and drove home seventy-two...The pitching staff posted a very respectable 3.65 ERA, ranking them eighth in the league. Mike Caldwell, who finished second in A. L. Cy Young Award voting, topped the team with 22 wins, six shutouts, and 131 strikeouts. He rang up a major league high 23 complete games. Lary Sorensen contributed 18 victories and completed 17 ball games. Lefthanders Jerry Augustine and Bill Travers won 13 and 12 games, respectively. The Brewers staff was the league leader with 16 shutouts and second in complete games (62)...Twenty-one-year-old Paul Molitor was the runner-up in Rookie of the Year balloting.
