Phillie Phanatic: After the season's first two months, the Phils were 1 ½ games out of first place with a 22-21 record and third in the NL East. From June 1st to the All Star break, the Phightins' reeled off 25 wins in 38 games to take over the division lead by 4 ½ games. From that point on, they were in sole possession of first place but had to beat the Pirates on the second-to-last day of the year, 10-8, to clinch their third straight division title. For the third consecutive post-season (two times by the Dodgers), the Phillies were denied a trip to the World Series, the last in 1950. Quaker City fans had to wait for another new year to roll around with hope that THIS time, their beloved Phils would punch a ticket to the Fall Classic...Now famous throughout the entire Universe, the "Phillie Phanatic" mascot, with all his greenness and hijinks, graced Veterans Stadium for the first time April 25th...Greg Luzinski's 35 home runs and 101 RBI led the ball club. Mike Schmidt, who led the team in runs scored (93), was second to "the Bull" with 21 homers and 78 RBI. Larry Bowa had the most base hits (192). A .258 team batting average ranked them third in the league as well as their 133 home runs...The Phillies pitching staff was third in ERA (3.33) and allowed the fewest walks (393). Steve Carlton topped the staff with 16 wins, 12 complete games, and 161 strikeouts. Larry Christenson and Dick Ruthven (re-acquired from Atlanta at the trade deadline) both won thirteen...Versus division opponents, the Phillies won 56 and lost 34.
