Fans of the Padres and the franchise alike had a lot to celebrate at the end of the season: The team's first winning record ever and a finish eleven games behind the NL West champion Dodgers. On June 9th, the ball club ended the day with a 23-31 record, in fifth place, and 9 ½ games from the top. After that date, the Padres reeled off 61 wins versus 47 losses, including a consecutive ten-game winning streak from July 25th through August 4th. They were a spectacular 51-30 at home...Thirty-nine-year-old Gaylord Perry fashioned a 21-6 W/L record (most wins in the N. L.) and led the pitching staff with 154 strikeouts. He became the second Padres hurler in three years (Randy Jones the other) to win the N. L. Cy Young Award. Jones won thirteen and Eric Rasmussen twelve. The relief corps topped the league with a combined 55 saves. "Rollie" Fingers' saves total topped the majors. The staff ERA was second-best in the N. L. at 3.28. They allowed the fewest home runs (74)...Dave Winfield posted his highest batting average ever for a season and led the team with 24 homers, 97 RBI, and 181 base hits—all career highs. The super-speedy Gene Richards scored the most runs (90) while rookie shortstop Ozzie Smith proved to be "The Wizard" of the infield and led the big leagues with 28 sacrifice hits...Versus the NL West: 36-36.
