The Nats hit .261 for the year and finished second in the N.L. with 194 home runs. Adam LaRoche led the ball club with 33 taters and 100 RBI. Ian Desmond and Ryan Zimmerman both blasted 25 dingers. Zimmerman had the team high in hits (163). Nineteen-year-old phenom Bryce Harper was the National League's Rookie of the Year after his 22 home run/59 RBI season. He was the Nationals' team leader with 98 runs scored..."Gio" Gonzalez was the ace of the pitching staff with a 21-8 record and 207 strikeouts. Stephen Strasburg struck out 197 batters and posted a 15-6 record. He walked only forty-eight. Jordan Zimmermann was 12-8 while Edwin Jackson and Ross Detwiler both won ten ball games. The staff had the lowest ERA in the N.L. (3.33)...The Nationals made the playoffs for the first time since 1981 when the franchise played in Montreal as the Expos. It also marked the first time a D.C.-based team made the post-season since 1933 when the American League's Washington Senators won the pennant...The Cardinals would eliminate the Nats in the NLDS, three games to two.
