Former White Sox star Robin Ventura was hired to manage the ball club on October 6, 2011. He had never managed in the minor leagues or amateur baseball...The team finished only three games behind the AL Central Division champ Tigers. Detroit won twelve of the eighteen games between the two. The Sox actually spent 104 days of the schedule in first place as late as September 25th. Their biggest lead came on July 17th (3 ½ games). Their record at mid-season was 44-37 (first place, two-game lead)...DH Adam Dunn was the big basher on the Sox with 41 homers and 96 RBI to lead the team. ("You can PUT IT ON THE BOOOOARRRD, YESS!") Television commentator Ken Harrelson uses that call after the Sox hit a home run. Four other players hit 25 or more home runs: Alex Rios, Dayan Viciedo, Paul Konerko, and A. J. Pierzynski. Rios also knocked home 91 runs while topping the ball club in hits (184) and runs scored (93). For the season, the White Sox hit .255 and were third in the A.L. in homers (211)...In his first year as a starter, southpaw Chris Sale was terrific by leading the pitching staff with a 17-8 record. He stuck out 192 batters. The questions about whether the tall, lean, side-arming Sale would hold up as a starter for a full season were more than answered. His powerful arm spoke for itself. Jake Peavy was the staff leader with 194 K's. He ended the year 11-12 and led the team with FOUR complete games. Righty Gavin Floyd won twelve. The staff ERA was 4.02.
