On December 8, 2011, the Angels pulled off an amazing coup in signing free agent first baseman Albert Pujols and pitcher C. J. Wilson to contracts totaling 331 million dollars. After the '11 season, ownership publicly stated they would be prime players for the top free agents. Boss Arte Moreno wasn't kidding... Where did the cash come from? A TV deal with FOX Sports worth 150 million dollars a year for the next 20 years...

Mark Trumbo was the home run leader with 32 dingers. Albert Pujols and Mike Trout, "The Millville Meteor," were next after both slammed 30 home runs. Pujols was the leader with 105 runs batted in. As for Trout, he was named the American League's Rookie of the Year, finished second in the MVP voting and led the majors with 49 stolen bases. The twenty-year old prodigy from New Jersey led the team in hits (182) and the major leagues in runs scored (129). Trumbo had 95 RBI; Trout knocked in 83 runs. Designated hitter Kendrys Morales added 22 home runs and 73 RBI. Torii Hunter hit 16 round-trippers and drove in ninety-two. The Angels led the A.L. in batting average (.274) and were fourth in home runs (187)...Jered Weaver's 20-5 record tied him with Tampa Bay's David Price for the most wins in the A.L. He led the pitching staff with three complete games which included two shutouts. C. J. Wilson was the strikeout leader with 173 K's. Dan Haren finished the season with 12 wins while Ervin Santana won nine. Closer Ernesto Frieri whiffed 80 batters and allowed only 26 hits. The staff's ERA of 4.02 was eighth in the league...The Angels finished five games behind division champ Oakland who won 10 of 19 games between the two AL West rivals...After April, the closest the ball club came to first place was 2 ½ games on June 11<sup>th</sup>. Their record at the All Star break was 48-38 placing them four games out of first.
